	For if you remain silent at this time, relief and deliverance for the Jews will arise from another place, but you and your father's family will perish. And who knows but that you have come to your royal position for such a time as this? Esther 4:14	
		• In remembering Vashti, do you think the king regretted acting in such haste? (verse 1)
• Notice in verse 8 that Esther was taken into the king's house before the problems arose which would necessitate her being there. How does that show God's hand on her life? On yours?		
 Why do you think Esther pleased Hegai so that he provided more for her than the others? 		
• Esther was about to be placed in a precarious situation; however, she was yielded to the Lord and kept her grounded to His thoughts and direction. How did this prepare her for what was to come?		
• In verse 17, we see that Esther was loved by the king and chosen as the new queen. Do you think it was her outward beauty alone that appealed to him?
